DANIEL CORNELL - b. March 18, 1757

DANIEL CORNELL and his family lived in Virginia in 1783. Was flooded out, then moved to New York & later to Ontario, Canada, where he established the first Grist Mill. Later moved to Pennsylvania, then to Cincinnati, Ohio. He finally settled in Ridgeville, Ohio in 1840. Some of his sons went to Indiana; Sylvanus went to Mt. Holly, Clermont County, Ohio; George N. located at Ridgeville, Warren County, Ohio; and Samuel at Lytle, Warren County, Ohio.

A short time after the death of ZERUIAH CORNELL (Daniel Cornell's wife), grandfather Daniel Cornell went back to visit his relatives in Canada. Sometime later while riding in a two horse sleigh--a team hitched to a bobsled ran into the sleigh from the back, the tongue striking Daniel who was instantly killed.

JESSE A CORNELL, Sec. 11, Des Moines township, eldest child of George Tyler and Elizabeth (Gibbs) Cornell, born in Warren Co., Ohio, 8 May 1871. The parents were born, reared and married in Warren County where the father engaged in farming until 1881, when the family removed to Iowa. Mr. and Mrs. Cornell had six children: (Presbyterian Church)

1-Jesse A.

2-Wilbur, deceased

3-Viola May, wife of Grant Cornell, a cousin, farming in Ohio.

4-Clarence 5-Ralph 6-Ernest Ray - all deceased.

In the paternal line Jesse A. Cornell is of Welsh extraction, his grandfather, George Cornell, having emigrated from Wales to the U.S. when a youth of 16 years. He settled in Ohio during the pioneer days and there three years later, when he was 19, married a Miss Hanna, native of New Jersey, who was 13 years of age.....The family of Mr. and Mrs. George Cornell numbered 18 children of whom the son George Tyler was the youngest.....

On Christmas Eve, 1896, Mr. Jesse A. Cornell married Miss Emma Jacobson, daughter of Gus F and Hannah (Edmonds) JACOBSON, both natives of Sweden. Children of Gus F. & Hannah JACOBSON:

Mr. Jesse A. Cornell's maternal grandfather, Jesse GIBBS and one uncle, Joseph GIBBS, were in the Civil War and went with Sherman on his famous march.

Born May 8, 1871 in Ohio, came to Jefferson County when 14, had been a resident of Jefferson County 62 years. Retired farmer. Had lived the past 12 years in Libertyville. Married Dec 24 1896 in Libertyville, Emma Jacobson, who survives. Also survived by children: Mrs. Rue Davis, Milwaukee; Mrs. Harold Swanson, Fairfield; E. L. Cornell, Kansas City, Mo., and Mrs. Frank Devore, Mt. Pleasant; 11 grandchildren and one greatgrandchild. Mr. Cornell is the last of his family. His sister, Mrs. Grant Cornell, died in Piqua, Ohio, a year ago.

Graveside services will be held at Fell Cemetery near Libertyville Monday afternoon. Born on a farm near Batavia in Wapello County; reared on a farm near Libertyville. After attending business college at Mount Morris, Ill., he joined the John Morrell Company at Ottumwa as a salesman. He was with the Morrell firm for 45 years until retirement a few years ago. Survivors include widow Martha; one son, Larry, Los Angeles, one daughter Ardiroy who lives at Fort Smith, Ark.; and a brother Elmer W. Copeland, Batavia.

\*2. Fairfield Tribune, Wed. May 10 1899 6-3. Wilbur Cornell died very suddenly at his home near Libertyville sometime between 10 o'clock Sat. night and Sunday morning. Youngest son of Mr and Mrs Tyler Cornell, who reside three miles west of Libertyville and was about 26 years old. He had not been in good health for several years.....Interred in Libertyville cemetery.

\*2. Tribune, Wed. Sept 11 1907 2-5. Tyler Cornell, an aged man and an old soldier, of Libertyville, died there at his home Monday about noon.....

Tribune, Wed. Sept 18 1907 3-6. LIBERTYVILLE, Sept. 16. Obituary. Tyler G. Cornell, born Feb 26 1845, died Sept 9, at 11:30 a.m. In Warren County, Ohio, he was married to Elizabeth Gibbs June 23 1870. Six children, four dying in infancy. The two living are: Jesse, on a farm west of Libertyville, and Viola, living in Ohio. Six grandchildren. They moved to Iowa in 1884, living in Libertyville in the home where he died, seven years. Besides wife, son and daughter, leaves also four brothers and four sisters.....Interment in Fell Cemetery.

*This Indenture* made this third day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and twelve, between Daniel Cornell Senr. of the County of Warren and State of Ohio of the one part, and Sylvanus Cornell Daniel Cornell Junr. George Cornell and Samuel Cornell of the County and State of Ohio of the other part, Witnesseth, that the Said Daniel Cornell Senr. for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and twenty dollars, current money of the United States to him hand paid the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and forever acquit and discharge the Said Sylvanus Daniel George and Samuel their heirs Executors and administrators, hath granted bargained sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien and confirm unto the Said <sup>Sylvanus</sup> Daniel George and Samuel their heirs and assigns forever all that Tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Warren of said being a certain Tract of land laid off under the direction of the Surveyor General of the United States in Section 22. twenty five in the third Township and fifth Range between the Miami River estimated to contain thirty six acres and thirty nine hundredths, which Tract of land was originally Granted to Benjamin Sloss, and by him assigned to Robert T. Sloss, bounded on the North by lands of George Harlan and Teahorn Archer and on the East by land of William M. Darrell on the South by land, now of the Said Sylvanus, Daniel, George and Samuel and on the West by land of Aaron Harlan, the Said Tract containing as aforesaid thirty six acres and thirty nine hundredths of an acre be the Same more or less, Together with all improvements water courses profits and appurtenances whatsoever to the Said premises belonging or in any wise appertaining and the Reversions Residues and profits thereof, and all the estate Right title interest property claim and demand of him The Said Daniel
