DANIEL CORNELL - b. March 18, 1757

DANIEL CORNELL and his family lived in Virginia in 1783. Was flooded out, then moved to New York & later to Ontario, Canada, where he established the first Grist Mill. Later moved to Pennsylvania, then to Cincinnati, Ohio. He finally settled in Ridgeville, Ohio in 1840. Some of his sons went to Indiana; Sylvenus went to Mt. Holly, Clermont County, Ohio; George N. located at Ridgeville, Warren County, Ohio; and Samuel at Lytle, Warren County, Ohio.

A short time after the death of ZERUIAH CORNELL (Daniel Cornell's wife), grandfather Daniel Cornell went back to visit his relatives in Canada. Sometime later while riding in a two horse sleigh—a team hitched to a bobsled ran into the sleigh from the back, the tongue striking Daniel who was instantly killed.
